Thoughts from our Principal ...

If you were around in the 80's, you may have received a friendship safety pin with colourful beads on them. Back then, elementary school students would wear these safety pins on their shoelaces. If you are a "Swiftie," you might have made friendship bracelets, also with various colours but also different shapes and sizes. The bracelets would be passed along to friends but sometimes to strangers as well. As an adult, there are times when I buy the same clothes as my friend because we want to be "twinning." I want to look like my friend. It worked! It worked so well because sometimes they call me by my friend's name instead of my own.



Friends are important to us. Friendships take time to nurture. Whether four years old, 14 years old, 40 or 140 years old, we all desire good friends to know us and love us, especially when we have a bad day or a fantastic day. I love reading Romans 12 when it says in verses 14-16, "Laugh with your happy friends when they're happy; share tears when they're down. Get along with each other; don't be stuck up." This week, we have organized for Shauna Barnes and Sarah Bruce to come to our classes on December 11. They will give a seminar to each grade on the topic of "What makes a friendship healthy?"
